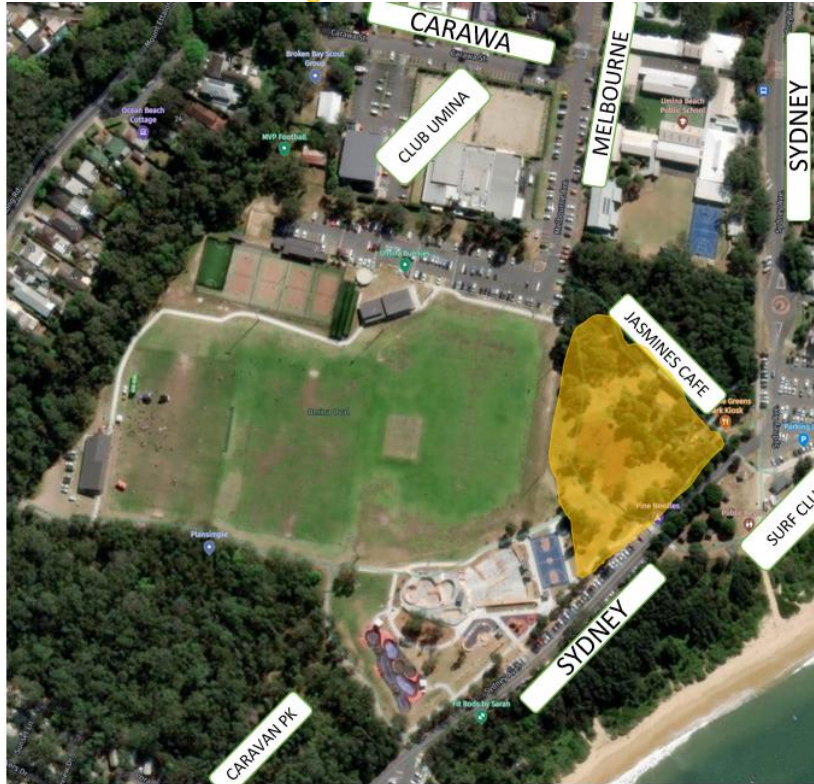

BARRIERS

Several safety measures at the location are permanently implemented to protect pedestrians and prevent unauthorized vehicle access at the 3 entry points around:

- 1. Melbourne Ave entry way
- 2. Sydney Road from the Umin Surf Club Entry way
- 3. Umina Surf Life Saving Club (SLSC) car park, / Jasmine Café entry



Pedestrian Safety Barriers

- Located at **Sydney Avenue (beach side for the entire length of parkway to the caravan park)** and **Melbourne Avenue** entries to align with main pedestrian flows.
- Compliant with **AS 1428.1 (Design for Access & Mobility)** to ensure accessibility. The car park features **pedestrian safety barriers** designed to separate foot traffic from vehicular areas. These **Sandstone block barriers** are positioned across all pedestrian access points to separate foot traffic from vehicle areas and are compliant with Australian standards tailored to accommodate sharp changes in alignment, ensuring pedestrian safety (See image following page)

Road Barriers

Permanent Road barriers are strategically placed to delineate vehicle lanes and pedestrian paths, reducing the risk of accidents. These barriers are large sand stone blocks to withstand impacts, ensuring that vehicles remain within designated areas and do not encroach upon pedestrian zones. (See image following page)

Hostile Vehicle Mitigation (HVM) Barriers

Sandstone blocks are installed across all areas with high foot traffic, these **Hostile Vehicle Mitigation (HVM) barriers** are permanently employed at the location and are designed to stop vehicles attempting to enter pedestrian zones, prevent unauthorised or hostile vehicle entry into pedestrian congregation zones and positioned to eliminate direct vehicle approach routes while maintaining pedestrian permeability. Secure Access Points

Steel access gates with locks installed at both **Sydney Avenue** and **Melbourne Avenue** entry points. Controlled access for authorised vehicles, emergency services, and event staff only. Integrated within the barrier system for continuity of protection. (See image following page)

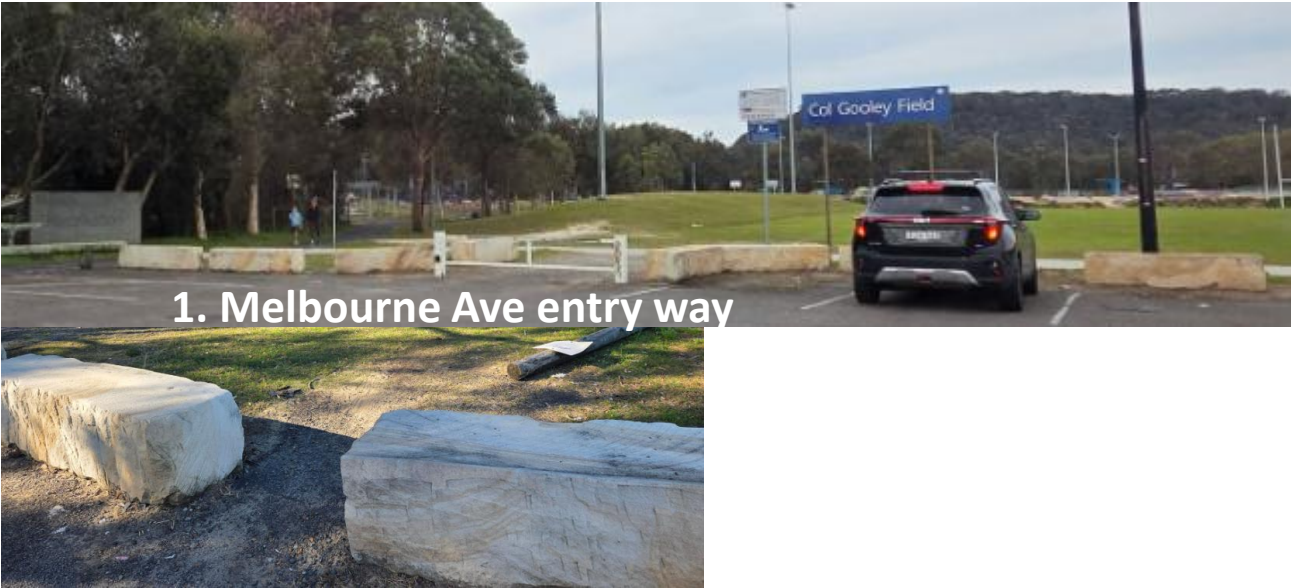

To ensure compliance with council requirements and relevant NSW safety standards, the following measures have been implemented at the **Sydney Avenue / Jasmine's Cafe entry point** of the Peninsula Recreation Precinct, Umina:

- 1. Pedestrian Safety Barriers** – Permanent bollards are installed to segregate pedestrian pathways from vehicular traffic, in accordance with NSW Roads and Maritime Services pedestrian safety guidelines.
 - 2. Road Barriers** – The permanent bollards also function to regulate vehicle access and prevent unauthorized entry to the festival site, maintaining safe circulation along Sydney Avenue.
 - 3. Hostile Vehicle Barriers (HVBs)** – Steel bollards rated to prevent vehicle intrusion in public pedestrian zones are installed at the entry, ensuring protection against potential vehicular threats in line with AS/NZS 1170.1 and Safe Urban Design standards.
 - 4. Pedestrian Barriers** – The permanent bollards provide a clear delineation of pedestrian areas from vehicle routes, maintaining compliance with NSW Planning for Bushfire Protection pedestrian safety requirements.

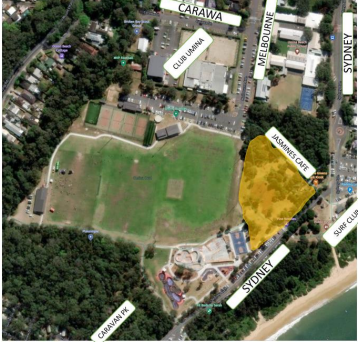

Licensed Area and Barriers

Coastal Twist Festival Liquor license 2026 will be held by either Six Strings or Funhaus Factory as per prior years. Council has requested (2025) the bar at least 25m south-west from the under 5's play area fence and at least 10m from the boundary edge of the children's climbing frame area.

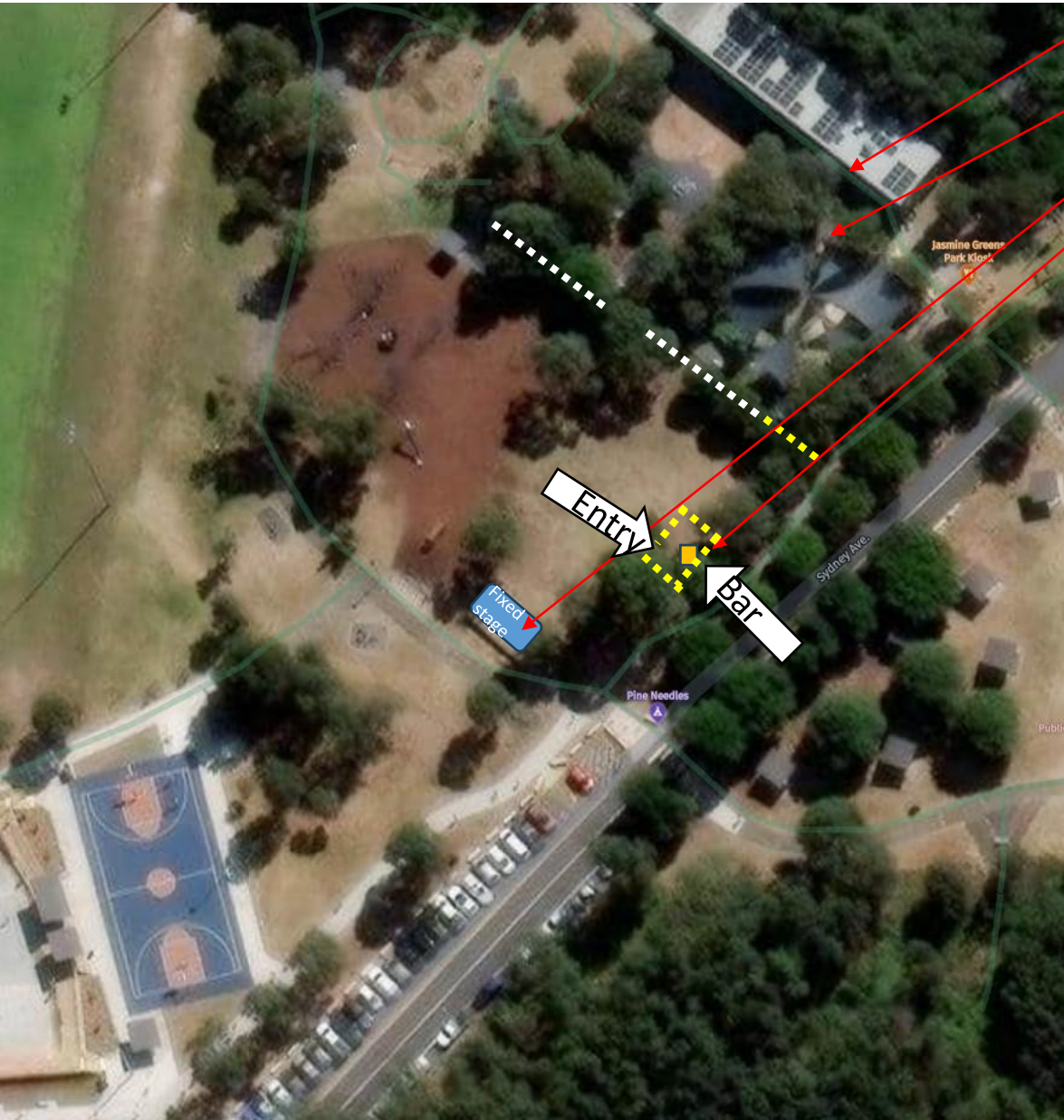
Fencing materials defining the licensed area is a combination of council's owned white picket fencing which is loaned to us annually (confirming with Gregg.Clark@centralcoast.nsw.gov.au) and steel orange panels each 2.1m long owned by Six Strings and loads of colorful bunting.

Alcohol purchased within CTF licensed area stays within this designated zone which separates patrons from non-patrons.

Note:

- *this is not a alcohol focused event*
- *this pop up is further fenced off from children's playground with council fencing, and a hill.*
- *Currently Jasmines café is licenced and within 5 metres of the children's area.*

BAR AREA (Wine & Beer Only) small pop up approx. 15m x 15m

- Position has been moved to address council request
- Children, accompanied by an adult, will also be allowed in the area.

- licensed area, entry and bar positioned at least 10m from the boundary edge of the children's climbing frame area.
- Alcohol purchased within the bar area will not be allowed to be consumed away from the licensed area

SITE UTELISED

Site utilised



There are no road closures proposed as part of this event.

Sydney Avenue will remain open at all times.

The only measure in place is temporary controlled access along the section between the Surf Club and NRMA Caravan Park, managed by traffic controllers purely for pedestrian and stallholder safety, and restrictions are lifted as soon as the event concludes.

There are no detours, no full road closures, and no Special Event Clearways.

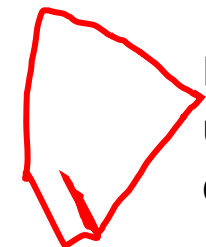

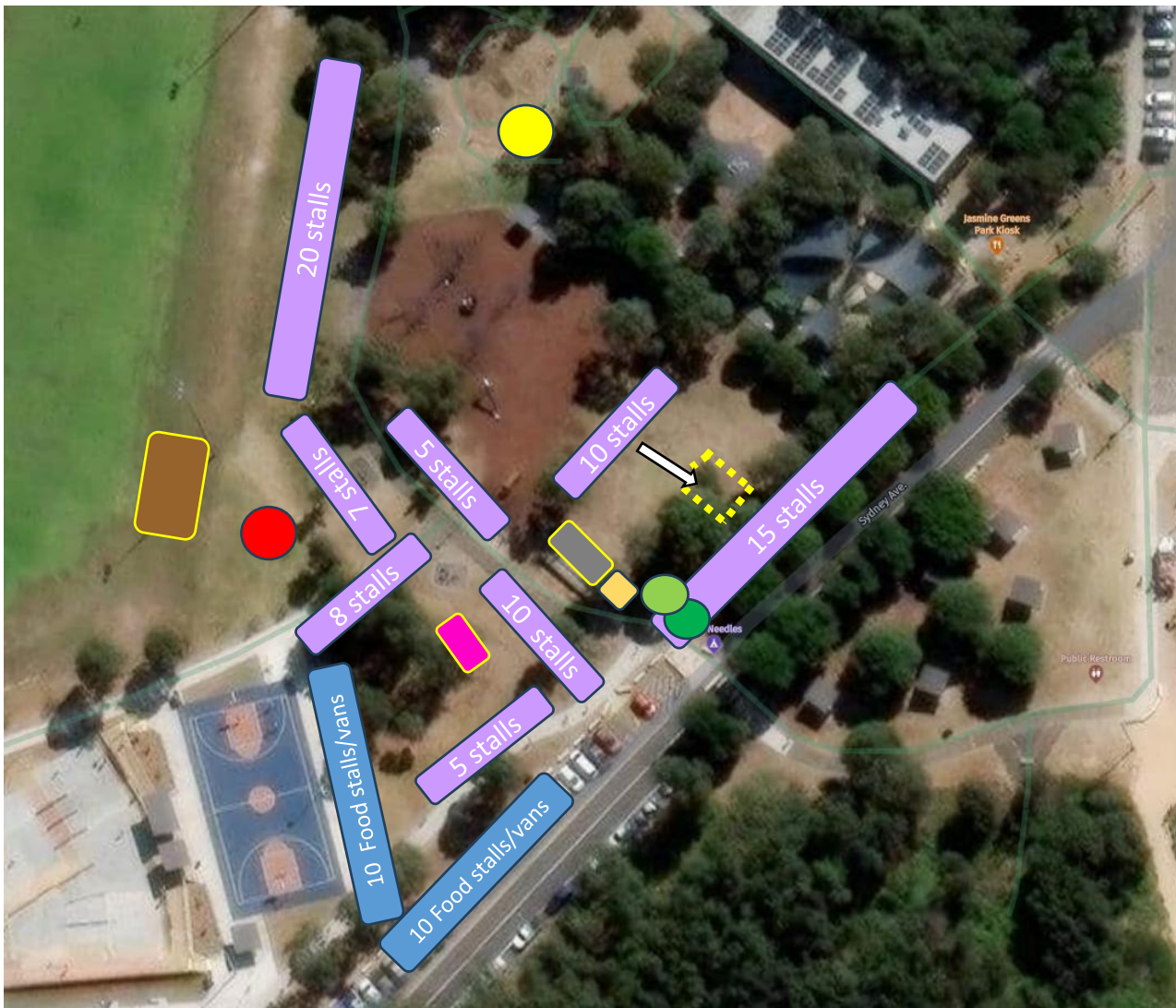

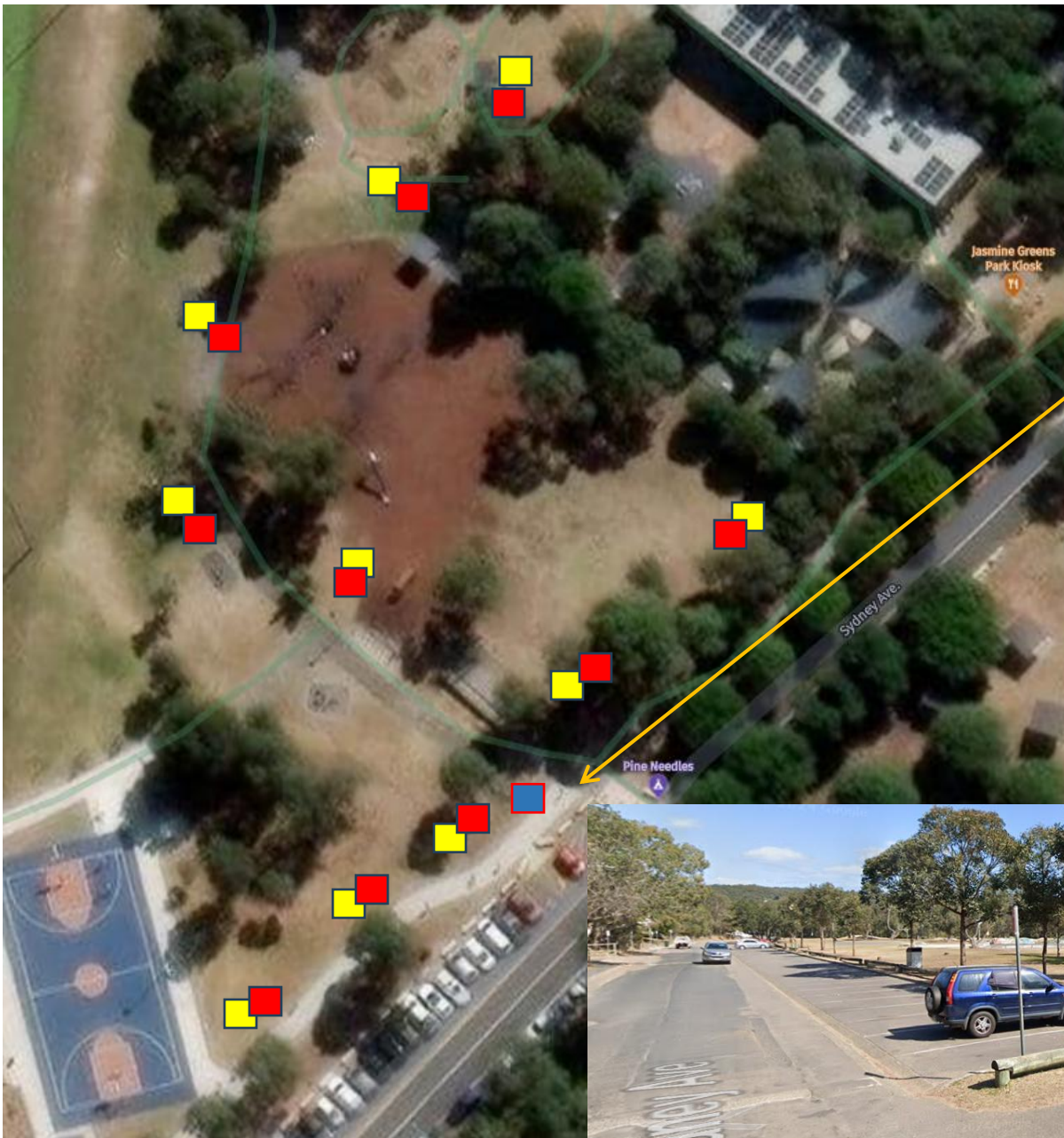


10. Bins locations, waste muster area, loading/unloading
